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There is no meeting happening this period, but here's the updates I'll compile.

Here are some updates on multiple fronts:

- Leila and her students have nearly completed their study, interviewing 12 individuals across the participant spectrum. That will finish this week, and Leila will present results at our next meeting in 2 weeks. My hope is that we can jump directly from these results into a short concept phase.
- Karen Salamy will be joining the team, welcome aboard! She's going to be helping out on the contextual data goals. I have passed on some materials to review.
- Ben and Eric met last Friday to discuss a collection of goals for the next rev of hardware, we're waiting for some results from the study, but anticipating we'll create a roughly 2-3RU box that will house some of the control components, and maybe offer some control room feedback from the system. We also need a place to collect all of the converters and reduce connector cycling on the capture cards.
- Eric met with DJ, and verified the carson system is still functional after movement in the racks to accomodate other equipment. Also a discussion of participant display and further integration into the science KVM was planned.
